



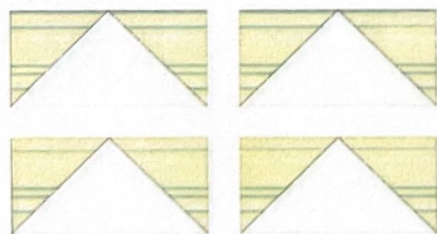
# Sawtooth Star Quilt Block Size-Cutting Chart

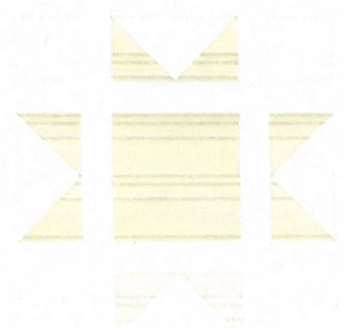

Using Fast Flying Geese technique, make four Flying Geese blocks using one "Goose square" (large triangle = white in diagram) and four "Sky squares" (gray in diagram). These will become star points.

Lay out four Geese/Star point units around four sides of center square with four Outside squares in the corners. Sew together in rows and then sew rows together to create Sawtooth Star Quilt Block.



### Sewing Instructions

#### Assemble a Block

To make one block gather the following pieces:

- (4) 3 1/2" squares of Light Fabric - Piece D
- (4) Flying Geese
- (1) 6 1/2" square of Dark Fabric - Piece A

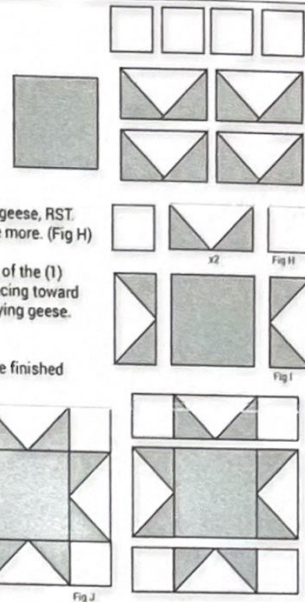
You will be making (25) total star blocks.

8. Sew (2) 3 1/2" squares to either side of (1) flying geese, RST. Press seams towards the flying geese. Repeat once more. (Fig H)

9. Pin and sew (2) of the Flying Geese to either side of the (1) 6 1/2" square, RST. Be sure that the light fabric is facing toward the outside of the block. Press seams toward the flying geese. (Fig I)

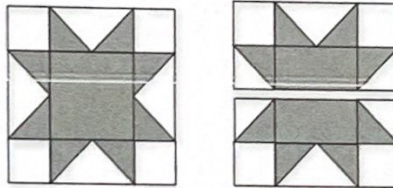
10. Pin and sew the finished units from Step 8 to the finished unit from Step 9, RST. Press seams open. (Fig J)

The unfinished block should measure a 12 1/2" square.



#### Cut Two Stars in Half

To create the fun offset design feature, you will need to choose (2) star blocks to be cut in half. These will create the top and bottom blocks in Columns 2 & 4 during assembly. Before cutting, be sure your blocks measure 12 1/2" and line them up on the mat. You will cut them in half, be sure the cut goes right through the flying geese points.
